Candidates would be assessed for selection through the following:

- a) **Academic background:** 20 Marks
- b) **Written test (60 minutes – 30 marks):** The question paper of the entrance test will be in the English language only. The written test will assess the candidate’s knowledge and sensitivity to contemporary social issues and his/her proficiency in English written communication skills, comprehension and analytical abilities.
- c) **Group Discussion (20 minutes – 20 marks):** The group discussion is to assess the candidate’s ability to conceptualize ideas, communicate effectively and contribute meaningfully in a group.
- d) **Personal Interview (10 to 15 minutes – 30 minutes):** the purpose of personal interview before a panel of experts is to find out the level of interest and aptitude for social work, social skills. peace building. The experience of helping people and the ability to cope with and learn from new situations.
