Justification for starting M.Phil and Ph.D programs

1. Since its inception, NEISSR has produced 3 batches of MSW professionals specializing in the areas of Peace and Conflict Transformation studies, Youth and Community Development. Many of them are observed in Govt and Non Govt sectors contributing to the organizations' mission and goals, many other cleared NET and few others starting their own organization for meaningful interventions.
2. Many who have cleared NET are unable to pursue higher studies, research or take teaching professions as they do not have such opportunities near homes.
3. Many who worked on their thesis on local specific issues of community and youth development, and conflict situation are unable to take off without deeper understanding of the situation. Hence, many of our students need opportunities to deepen their theoretical understanding and sharpen their skills in transforming conflicts in societies by taking up further advance course in their specialized fields. NEISSR is called upon to meet these needs.
4. NEISSR being the only Institute providing Peace and Conflict Transformation Studies has to develop its capacities to meet the challenges of transforming the violent conflict situation in the region by producing professionals in the field and increasing their numbers in specialized areas of interventions at all levels starting from legislation, policy and programming levels. North eastern region need professional young men and women who mediate and facilitate dialogue processes to resolve and transform many of the historical, cultural, political economic conflicts situations and provide a space for a community of peace practitioners from around the world

NEISSR has to provide professional development opportunities near home to address many of the conflicts and development issues for many capable youth from Nagaland and the regions at affordable costs to prevent drain out of youth energies from their own homes and region.
