#### Training on Professional Practice Skills for 21st Century Social Workers


Education 5.0 stresses the need of education to retouch with humanistic values in an age of internet and advancement of technology. There is greater need for younger generation to reconnect, reinvent in Post Covid scenario that saw a fast changing system in the way education is imparted and viewed upon. Keeping in view the challenges and learning gaps among the youths and students of social workers, a practice based course that work towards for the welfare and upliftment for the society, NEISSR has organized two days orientation program on Skill Building for Social Workers at Peace Center, Chümoukedima. 113 social work students along with faculty members of NEISSR attended the program.

The orientation program was conducted by Dr. Jonas Richard A, Director, Centre for Life Skills Education (CLSE), Kristu Jayanti College, Bengaluru. During the orientation program, it touched upon relevant 21<sup>st</sup> century skills such as soft skills, technical skills and professional skills were covered. Dr. Jonas spoke about the importance of having the rights skills and attitude to become a successful social worker. He stresses that self awareness which is the conscious knowledge of oneself is fundamental in responding to one's own circumstances in helping people reconnect with core of human values a prerequisite towards finding inner peace.

Dr Sherman Kuek, Professor of Theology and Dialogue, Christian Institute for Theological Engagement (CHRISTE) and Convener of Splendor Project, Malaysia also gave a lecture on the importance of Dialogue and a requisite skill for peace building process. In his statement he opines the world need peace makers rather than peace keeper. He talked about various dimension of dialogue and the importance of adopting inclusive dialogue that affirms as well as gave space to understand and include different set of ideology, faith and beliefs in a pularistic society like India.

Life skills education has been given importance in the light of new education policy and university has taken effort to sharpen and develop life skills among students to complement the need and requirement of society especially for social workers in their approach with the larger community. Building on the needs and in harnessing potentials of youth for nation building NEISSR have initiated 'SKILL ME' program in 2022 and in the process of inducted into the education curriculum. Skill development program intends to adopt along the line of a 'MORUNG', a traditional Naga system of imparting education. Two days orientation program saw the building of life skills among social workers who would in turn be trainers and carry forward in building skills of Nagaland Youths. Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Fr. C.P. Anto Principal NEISSR talked about the importance of imparting soft skills, and churning education for more mindfulness to make students more humane in their dealing with others when at times relationship has become mechanical.

During the orientation program the students also had the opportunity to take part in group activities and discussion. Through this, the students learnt how to self reflect and handle different types of cases and how to effectively communicate ideas and enhance solving problem skills.

#### MSW DISSERTATION

Dissertation in the final (fourth) semester is an academic requirement for the students to qualify for the award of Master of Social Work. The purpose of the dissertation is to make the students familiar with research process and to in-still a research attitude in them. For the purpose of dissertation students are expected to take up research on a topic relating to social work practice with a sample size between 30-50 respondents. Accordingly, the students of final semester submitted their dissertation paper covering widerange of topics like traditional method of conflict resolution, youth unemployment, rural development, livelihood, and so on.

#### **ORIENTATION PROGRAMME 2018**

North East Institute of Social Sciences and Research organised an orientation programme for the MSW students on 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2018. The students were warmly welcomed by Fr. John Poji the Administrator and Vice-Principal of NEISSR and invoked God's presence with an invocation prayer. In the opening session Peace Activist Mr. Arhomo Nugllie exhorted in his short message to the students that Master of Social Work is not only about specific field of study but it includes multiple field of study where an individual is exposed to different subject matter like, psychology, science, history, politics, management, entrepreneurship etc.

Dr. Fr, C.P Anto the principal of NEISSR talked about the importance of setting a goal in life. In his interaction with the students he reminded all the participants to have the attitude of possibility thinking and vision oneself the future into reality. Fr. C.P Anto encouraged all the participants not to be swayed away by negative forces, or be frustrated by obstacles that may develop on the way towards reaching the goal. He discussed about the advantages and disadvantages of goal setting to the participants, and mentioned that social worker can work in different settings like in Health, Rights, Welfare sector, Agency administrator, Institutional settings and Community Development under NGOs', Industries, Government Organization, Corporates, and others. To set a goal effectively, one should have the skills to conduct SMART goal training, where the goal should be- Specific, Measureable, Achievable, Realistic and Time-phase (SMART). One should also conduct SWOT analysis, where it will help to identify the Strength, Weakness, Opportunities and Threats, he added. Furthermore Dr. Fr. C.P Anto pointed out the development of education should be on three perspective qualities-the head level of understanding, analyzing and functioning, the heart level of empathy and feelings for other and the hand level of reaching out to the needy people who need our help.

At the end of interaction, the speaker urged all the participants to be a source of social healer within the family to community, and to society as well. During the reflection time, one of the students shared with great enthusiasm that he had ran out of fuel but got refilled after attending the session. Another one of the trainee Ms. Susan, gave a reflection and urged the participants saying that there's no age bound to learn, but again not to wait too long if one wanted to pursue further studies. Questioning on how a leader should act or respond by one of the students, Dr. Fr. C.P Anto encouraged all the students to practice participatory leadership which is not dominating, but to be a kind of leader who are informative, aware, inclusive, and at the same time make another set of new leaders.
