Summary:

Capacity building programme on “Promotion of Peace through Mass media” was conducted on with Ms. Tovi as resource person. The programme begins with an ice breaker games which was initiated by the facilitator Mr. Alan Paul. Later the resource person took a session on the topic cited above. She began her session by explaining the present scenario of the youth using social media in everyday life. She said, in today’s world, mass media and communication play a vital role in human life and is considered an absolute must for modern living. Mostly people rely on the mass media to provide information regarding political and social issues, entertainment and news. She further said that media is a collective communication outlet or tools that are used to store and deliver information or data for future use. Mass media is the primary means of communication used to reach the vast majority of the

general public. The most common platforms for mass media are newspapers, magazines, radio, television and the internet.

The resource person further stressed on the role of media in promoting peace. She said, media can play a vital role in promoting peace in the society as many people use media in their day to day life. And as they are part of social media, they get influence by whatever information is being shared in the social media. Therefore Ms.Tovi encouraged the participants to make use of media in a positive way so as to promote peace and send the message of peace to the world through media. She also talked about the negative effects of mass media where she said that media has developed into one of the primary agents of socialization for children and youth. It teaches social norms and even influences how they perceive gender roles. Mass media and communication have also negatively affected teenagers. Media is dominated by sexualized images that place values on slim bodies and youthful appearance. Additionally, it is often debated whether or not violent images in movies and video games affect the way children view violence. She further said that the media should cover the aspects of society and culture that are positive and constructive, such as peace literature, poetry and drama, art and culture. It should provide a platform to poets, playwrights and artists who are conscious of the necessity of building the new pluralistic system. Thus, media can help to create the new multicultural system that would promote the global advancement of humankind toward global identification and unity, while keeping one's own traditions and intrinsic cultural identity. Towards the end of the session the resource person urged the club members to make use of the social media wisely so as to spread and promote peace.

Peace channel conducted a 4 day soft skill training on 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th of August, 2020. Mr. MughatoSwu was the resource person. The main objective of this training:

1. enhance skills on how to use social media effectively
2. to get expert in using adobe Photoshop
3. to learn the basic skills needed for editing pictures & videos in a standardized form



Day 1

The first day of the training was a briefing day for the various uses of social media.

Areas focused:

- Management of online product advertisement in websites
- Photoshop applications

Day 2

The second day of the training mainly focused on photoshop. Through Adobe Photoshop application, the trainer instructed the staffs about process of photo editing and saving files in the right format.

Day 3

The third day training consisted of enhancing Photoshop skills. Emphasizing on the steps of photoshop, the trainer directed all the staffs to follow his lead in editing pictures, downloading the proper quality and size of pictures, adding text, merging background and creating flyers/ posters accordingly. The session went ahead with individual editing activity as suggested by the trainer and orderly submit it to him as an assignment to monitor the progress of each individual.

Day 4

The fourth day of the training involved video editing through applications and social media account management. The concerned procedure followed was, the managing of personal YouTube accounts, linking Instagram and Facebook accounts, the proper criteria/regulation to monetize videos etc. Brief highlight on how to operate Zoom meetings was also carried out during the session. The session further involved individual activity in editing independence day poster with an evaluation from the trainer.

The four-day Soft skill training concluded with the trainer appreciating the participants for their efforts in E-learning and further encouraged the participants to exercise the editing skills more often to refine their skills and for effective results.

At the end of the session, Mr. Mughato took the time to encourage each person in the room to start emphasizing & practicing the various inputs that were taught so far in the class. To ask him via calling if there is any queries regarding the classes that were taken. After his talk, a vote of thanks was given by the Director Fr. C.P. Anto where he thanked the resource person for teaching and helping the animators enrich their skills.

Objective:

To educate the Women leaders on the need for peaceful conflict resolutions and exemplify the principles of peaceful cohesion and existence

Summary:

NEISSRand Peace Channel conducted a training programme for the Catholic Women leaders from all over Nagaland on 16th April 2021 at DAN, Dimapur.

Mrs Caroline Leisan, Programme Coordinator facilitated the programme and introduced Peace Channel to the participants, and stressed on the need for women initiatives in peace-building initiatives within the family and enhance them through communities.

Resource person, Dr C.P Anto, acknowledges the women folk for being peace-builders, mediators and peacemakers throughout history and encouraged them to continue the spirit throughout to reach the unreached. Women always stand for peace and dialogue through which the different communities need to rely on for sustenance and co-existence. Women are peace lovers and at the same time, women also have been the most vulnerable in times of violence and wars. Throughout the history of violence and wars, women are always at the forefront to deescalate such issues in the lives of the people and such exemplary roles were experienced through Naga Mother's Association and Rwanda etc.

Women being the initiators of peace in families and in societies, he also urged the participants to live exemplary and shared the five principles of peace to be developed within oneself as in;

1. **Spirituality:** All of us believe in a spiritual unseen supreme being, which also guided us in our behaviours, attitudes and actions. It is also through our own individual spirituality we derive peaceful mind-sets and outlooks in life, also in believing that we are all the children of God as human beings. In view of that, as peace builders, we should consider every human being as equal and respect everyone. Peace is inclusive of both having a union with God but also, living a righteous life before Him.

2. **Reconciliation:** Through our culture and tradition of human race, the goodness of life always lies in forgiving others and not revenge. In most of our life's situations, we prioritize our stance with keeping ourselves ahead before the others. We give so much importance for 'I' rather than 'We'.

Two is better than one, and thus, coming together surpassing all differences is one of the goodness of life. 'Coming together' reflects that we forgave each other and formed a single voice as 'WE' for the common good of everyone

3. **Self-Realization:** One of the core objective of peacebuilding is to transform oneself in the aspect of humanity prescribes in the form of physical, mental, emotional, social, economic and spiritual composition. Self-realization in these aspects thus, becomes a prior objective in order to layout oneself in the service of peace to humanity. Acceptance of the self and others irrespective of individual traits reduces any form of conflicts arising out of rejection on the ground of tribe, caste and religion.

4. **Non-Violence:** Non-violence is another priority of extensive peace building. To build a society of peaceful co-existence, advocacy and practice of non-violent means in our behaviour, speech and action becomes a must. Non-violence is the most powerful tool to respond any forms of interpersonal, inter-family, inter-community and international relations. It is thus, important to build a universal principle for sustainable peace and harmony in our society.

5. **Dialogue:** throughout human history, violence was used to resolve violence overtime, and as such, has been hampering lives extensively over period of years. It is through a culture of violence which have to be transformed and in such a desired perspective, a practice of mutual accommodation of conflicting parties is required to achieve positive social transformation. It is through peaceful conversation and dialogue where locally arranged

knowledge and experiences are enhanced in order to work effectively in resolving conflicts without the use of violence to respond to violence.

He further challenged the womenfolk to live exemplary lives to influence, create credible image, and provide truth and justice to the society.
